Calm Jar

You will need:

- A clear recycled jar with a secure lid
- · Warm water
- · Clear PVA glue
- Food colouring
- · Glitter
- Confetti sequins or gems





Clean your clear jar using warm water and soap. Dry the jar well and make sure that the lid fits tight.



Pour warm water into your jar (with the help of an adult). Keep pouring into your jar until it is just over half full.


Strand unit: Stories




Soon the monks felt the island move under their feet. Then the island began to sink in the water. The monks were afraid. They called out to Brendan to help them.
